MAINTENANCE

As good as new finish can be maintained by following these guidelines:

- 1) Dry out the tray fully after every use, to avoid build-up of limescale and soap residue.
- Clean the shower tray regularly using a damp cloth or sponge, followed by a soft dry cloth. 2)
- 3) Occasionally use a non-abrasive cleaner to remove stubborn stains.

- The Company warrants that it will (at the Company's choice) either repair or replace, or refund the 1.1 full purchase price of any goods which are accepted by the Company as being defective or not in accordance with the contract or any express description or representation given or made by or on behalf of the Company in respect of the goods within a period of 12 months from despatch of such goods from the Company's works ('the warranty period') save that this warranty shall not apply where the defect or fault is attributable to defective materials supplied by third parties where the Customer's only remedy will be against that third party or where the defect or fault is attributable to the goods not being installed or maintained in accordance with the Company's installation and maintenance instructions. Installation Instructions

Inspection

Please read carefully. Check your tray for any visible signs of damage.

Please note that this inspection should be done prior to installation. The fitting of this tray will be seen as acceptance of quality. Instructions must be adhered to as the manufacturers will not accept responsibility for incorrect installation.

IMPORTANT: We recommend top access 50mm easy clean wastes. Wastes should be fitted with rubber seals or silicone (not putty, etc). DO NOT OVER TIGHTEN. If this shower tray is installed in conjunction with a steamer, the steam outlet must be at least 300mm from the top of the shower tray.

To prevent the possibility of water damage check all connections are water tight and that the tray is adequately sealed along the tiling line

RISER INSTALLATION INSTRUCTIONS

Carefully unwrap your shower tray.

Lay the tray face down on a dust sheet.

Fix the legs into the inserts incorporating the panel clips as shown in 1 & 2 diagrams

Position the tray in situation and level to the correct height as shown in diagram 4.

When using upstand trays mark the wall and chase into the plaster as in diagram 3.

Make all plumbing connections, screw down accessible legs and remove the protective film from the tray

At this point a dust sheet or other protection in the tray base is required.

Commence tiling.

N.B. For flat top trays it is recommended that an adhesive, flexible tiling upstand be used.





After the tiling and grouting is completely dry (approx 24 hrs), silicone sealant can be applied to the joint between the tray and the tiles as
